

ORDINANCE NO. 109

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF THE ALDEN CITY CEMETERY

The City Council of the City of Alden, Freeborn County, Minnesota so ordain and establish as follows:

1. That the piece or parcel of land deeded by quit claim deed to the said city by the Alden Union Cemetery Association on the 11th day of January 1902 and recorded in the office of the Registrar of Deeds in and for said county on the 13th day of February 1902 at 7:43 o'clock a.m., in the Book of Deeds, on page 629, shall forever be and the same is hereby dedicated to the use and purpose of a public burying ground.
2. The above said piece or parcel of land shall be known and designated as the Alden City Cemetery and shall be under the full control of the City Council of the said City of Alden.
3. The officers of the said cemetery shall be a president, an actuary and a treasurer; and the president of the City Council shall be president of the cemetery, the City Clerk shall be actuary, and the City Treasurer shall be treasurer thereof.
4. The said officers of the said cemetery, with the other members of the City Council shall have full power and control thereof to sell and convey lots for burial purposes, but shall sell lots for no other purpose, to hire and employ laborers, to improve or care for the premises and may pay therefore out of any money of the city in their hands not otherwise appropriated; to fix the price of lots, and to have different prices therefore, as may seem to them just. Thirty percent of the price paid for a lot or lots will be deposited in a Permanent Care and Improvement Fund for upkeep.
5. All deeds conveying title to lots in the said cemetery shall be signed by the president and actuary. Provided that no deed to any lot shall be granted until the price fixed by the officers shall have been paid in money to the officers granting said deed.
